The purpose of the Oneida Education Foundation is to encourage business and community involvement in the schools in Oneida School District and to actively seek supplemental resources to assure SUCCESS FOR EVERY STUDENT enrolled in and physically attending the schools full time in Oneida School District.

The Oneida Education Foundation was established in 1988 to raise funds for Oneida County Schools. The OEF provides a channel by which individuals and businesses may donate money to the schools and receive tax benefits as well as the satisfaction of having assisted the Oneida County schools, teachers, and students. It is a nonprofit organization that functions independently of the Oneida School Board and District while cooperating with school officials to benefit teachers and students. The OEF operates under its own by-laws and elects its own board members and officers. Each school in the district has a representative on the board; the majority of board members are community members, all of whom serve as volunteers. The board meets monthly to plan its grant-giving and fund-raising projects.

OEF PRIORITIES FOR GRANT GIVING

The OEF Board has the following priorities for the awarding of grants:

- 1) Classroom/curriculum grants for supplies, materials, and equipment 65%
- 2) Scholarships 30%
- 3) Grants for co-curricular activities 5%

OEF GOALS FOR 2018-2019

- 1) Continue to spend revenues according to the following budget guidelines:
 - All designated funds will be spent as specified by donors.
 - All non-designated funds will be spent as follows:

Curriculum/classroom grants to teachers: 65% Scholarships: 30% Administrative expenses: 5%

- 2) Continue the curriculum and classroom grant fund raising and giving functions of the OEF and better define these functions in the by-laws.
- 3) Begin to compile a procedures manual to include all forms, sample letters, etc.
- 4) Continue to grant scholarships to all seniors who meet the criteria for receiving OEF-funded and sponsored scholarships; define those criteria in the "scholarships" section of a procedures manual.
- 5) Increase funding of the OEF through grant writing, endowments, and long-term fund-raising projects.
- 6) Build all endowment funds to a minimum of \$5000 over the next three years.
- 7) Increase contact with alumni of Malad High School to encourage support for OEF projects.

OEF ACHIEVEMENTS IN 2018-2019

- 1) Awarded all classroom and curriculum grants that met the priorities for grants.
- 2) Awarded scholarships to all graduates of Malad High School who met the criteria for receiving an OEF scholarship.
- 3) One new endowment fund was established. Marvin Hess established the J. MARVIN AND SANDRA PRICE HESS SCHOLARSHIP FUND in memory of his wife, Sandra. The annual \$3000 scholarship is to go to a student planning to major in a STEM field.
