ONEIDA EDUCATION FOUNDATION SCHOLARSHIP APPLICATION

Deadline for OEF Scholarship Application: Thursday, April 10, 2025

Eligibility criteria for scholarships:

- **Full-time** enrollment and physical attendance at Malad High School for a minimum of **TWO years, including the student's entire senior year**. (Exceptions may be made by written appeal to the OEF Board prior to the scholarship application due date. The OEF meets monthly on the second Wednesday.)
- Official graduation from Malad High School on or before the date of the Malad High School Commencement program in May 2025.
- Acceptance by a university, college, or vocational/technical school **accredited by a nationally recognized regional college/university accrediting association.** (Accreditation status of colleges will be checked.) All students, including those who intend to delay attending college, must indicate their college preference. Acceptance by and enrollment at an accredited college will be required before scholarship funds will be disbursed.
- Completion of scholarship application, including transcripts and letters of recommendation.
- Plan to attend accredited institution of postsecondary education within three years of graduation from Malad High School (enroll and request scholarship by end of August 2028). Attendance at a college or university must be full time as defined by the college or university.

Incomplete or late applications will not be considered.

THE OEF DOES NOT GUARANTEE THAT EVERY APPLICANT WILL RECEIVE A SCHOLARSHIP.

Application Process:

- Get application from the Malad High School Counselor's Office. Mrs. Nacona Smith will distribute the application via email to all seniors who request it. The scholarship application is also on the OEF website (https://oneidaeducationfoundation.org) and on the Oneida School District website (www.oneidaschooldistrict.org/page/oneida-education-foundation).
- Complete the application, including two letters of recommendation, prior to the deadline of Thursday, April 10, 2025. Turn in **THREE** copies of the application to the Malad High School Counselor's Office.
- Request copies of your official transcript of your high school grades and SAT/ACT scores from the High School Counselor's Office.
- Include a **1-page (full page)** double-spaced Written Statement. Describe your future educational and vocational/career goals and how you plan to use the scholarship money.
- Include **TWO** letters of recommendation. <u>One letter of recommendation must be</u> <u>from a MALAD HIGH SCHOOL teacher from whom you took a class</u> so he or she can address your academic potential and achievement. (Coaches, administrators, counselors, staff, aides, Seminary teachers, and Senior Project mentors do NOT qualify as teachers unless they taught and graded a high school class in which you were enrolled.) FAILURE TO HAVE A LETTER OF RECOMMENDATION FROM A HIGH SCHOOL TEACHER WILL DISQUALIFY YOU FROM CONSIDERATION FOR A SCHOLARSHIP.
- Some scholarships have specific requirements for the letters of recommendation; be sure to follow the requirements. Failure to have letters of recommendation that meet requirements will exclude you from consideration for those scholarships.
- The same two letters of recommendation will satisfy the requirements for all the OEF scholarships for which you apply. You do not have to have different letters for each scholarship as long as you meet any specific requirements.

These scholarships will be awarded based on quality of application and how well the applicant meets the scholarship criteria. High school grades, SAT/ACT scores, and financial need may be considered but will not be the only criteria for most of these scholarships.

Scholarships will be announced at the Senior Awards Assembly in May 2025.

Awarding of a scholarship and the monetary value of the scholarship depend on availability of funding and the specifications of donors.

Scholarships must be used within 3 years of award date (by end of August 2028) for education-related expenses. Attendance at post-secondary institution must be full time, as defined by the college or university.

Scholarship recipients must write thank-you letters to the donors of their scholarships (names and addresses will be provided) before scholarship funds will be disbursed. Thank-you letters must be turned in to the OEF Treasurer along with either evidence of enrollment in a college or Scholarship Deferment Form.

All recipients AND THEIR PARENT OR GUARDIAN must sign and abide by the Scholarship Terms of Agreement. Copies of the Scholarship Terms of Agreement will be enclosed with the scholarship award letters.

NOTE: The OEF will hold scholarships for up to 3 years to allow students who go on church missions, serve in the military, or delay attending college for any reason to qualify for and receive OEF scholarships. A scholarship recipient who delays attending college must sign a **Scholarship Deferment Form** indicating his or her plans and return it to the OEF in order for the scholarship to be held.

All scholarship applications require TWO letters of recommendation; one must be from a high school teacher from whom you took a class. Other specifications for letters of recommendation are listed below.
