The Oneida Education Foundation was established in 1988 to raise funds for Oneida County Schools. The OEF provides a channel by which individuals, families, businesses, and organizations may donate money to the schools and receive tax benefits as well as the satisfaction of having assisted Oneida County schools, teachers, and students. It is a nonprofit organization that functions independently of the Oneida School Board and District while cooperating with school officials to benefit teachers and students. The OEF operates under its own by-laws and elects its own board members and officers. Each school in the district has a representative on the board; the majority of board members are community representatives, all of whom serve as volunteers. The board meets monthly to plan and to conduct its grant-awarding and fund-raising projects.

OEF GOALS FOR 2022-2023

- 1) Continue to spend revenues according to the following budget guidelines:
 - All designated funds will be spent as specified by donors.
 - All non-designated funds will be spent as follows:

Curriculum/classroom grants to teachers:	65%
Scholarships:	20%
Co-curricular supplies/equipment	5%
Fund raising	5%
Administrative expenses:	5%
 - 2) Continue the curriculum and classroom grant-fund raising and -giving functions of the OEF and define these functions in a procedures manual.
 - 3) Compile a procedures manual to include all forms, sample letters, etc.
 - 4) Continue to grant scholarships to all Malad High School seniors who meet the criteria for receiving OEF-funded and -sponsored scholarships; define those criteria in the “scholarships” section of a procedures manual.
 - 5) Increase funding of the OEF through grant writing, endowments, and long-term fund-raising projects.
 - 6) Build all endowment funds to a minimum of \$5000 over the next three years.
 - 7) Increase contact with alumni of Malad High School to encourage support for OEF projects.
